PORT AUGUSTA TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION CLUB HISTORY

In 2005 the club applied for and was successful in obtaining a grant to develop, manage a co-ordinate a new Table Tennis Competition in Port Augusta.

This sport had not been played in a structured form for 20 years in Port Augusta and after applying and receiving a grant through the Department of Sports and Recreation the club arranged "Come and Try" nights with over 75 juniors and 90 senior players registering in the first 3 weeks.

Volunteers who are members of the club have arranged the coaching and management of the new competition.

The new competition has enabled Senior citizens, Indigenous people, juniors and adults alike to be involved in a sport that encourages social interaction and physical activity to many who would not normally participate.

The club aimed to encourage Indigenous and local young people who encountered boredom, to have the opportunity to be involved with active participation, healthy lifestyles, cross culturalism and social interaction through the competition.

The significant achievements or initiatives in the last 12 months.

A structured competition is now being held at the South Augusta Football Club every Monday night and players of all standards have been welcoming with the team competition that started on the 20th of March, juniors and adults included.

Currently over 70 players compete and teams have been organised with 8 teams with 6 players per team and over the 12 months the competition has enabled players of all ages to participate.

At this stage there has been 11 players aged 60-70 years, 17 players 50-60 years and 7 players aged 40-50 years of age participating in either the come and try and competition nights.

There has been no cost to participants in first season to encourage everyone to participate and bats and balls have been supplied.

The Club also arranged for 4 weeks of coaching sessions for Indigenous schoolchildren from the Carlton Primary school at no cost to encourage participation by youth within the area.

The club also has held 4 sessions for the Active after schools' program that will encourage Indigenous youth to participate in the project.

The competition has provided participants with the motivation to improve their ability with the opportunity to participate in inter town competitions and visits to other regions.

Originally the Port Augusta Table Tennis Competition' "Come and Try" nights had been a great success with over 75 juniors and 90 senior players registering in the first 3 weeks. A visit from representatives of the Whyalla Table Tennis Association who provided coaching assistance was a highlight of the second week.

How the project has contributed to the region.

The club recognised that there had been a decline in physical activity levels in Port Augusta and it aimed to provide another very affordable alternative to our community by offering an activity that is physically less demanding than some others. The club felt that it would be a sport that would be attractive to both males and females within the town.

Currently there is a very low participation rate of Indigenous and mature aged people in any types of sporting activities within the town. Port Augusta has an Indigenous population of approximately 20 per cent. Indigenous are mainly involved in sports such as Football, Netball and Basketball in Port Augusta and this competition provided another alternative to these mainstream sports.

The competition has developed coaches who can now go out to regional areas and promote the sport within remote communities such as Lyndhurst, Andamooka and Yunta who have recently purchased tables for their community halls. Andamooka recently purchased a table and held a Table Tennis clinic for interested youth, the article attached for your information.

A relationship has been formed with the State Governing body, Table Tennis SA for advice and guidance in the operation of the competition and the Whyalla Table Tennis Association based at Whyalla 80 kms from the town has provided mentor support to the project.

The Indigenous Sport Development Officer employed by the Office for Recreation and Sport has also supported and promoted the program throughout the Indigenous Community.

The Port Augusta City Council through the Active Community Field Officer are also willing to promote the program to interested participants in the area. We aim to be an enthusiastic member of the Port Augusta Recreation and Sport Network.

Background information on the activities e.g. aims and objectives of the event/ project, outcomes and achievements of the event/ project, impact on the community.

This project aimed to create a Table Tennis competition in Port Augusta that will increase participation of people in the sport particularly Indigenous and the mature aged.

The project also aimed to will provide a Table Tennis competition that will encourage people of all abilities and physical active levels to play in either social or competitive games played in a safe and non-threatening environment.

When the project started the club , because a structured competition had not taken place in the town for over 30 years it was expected that over 60 people would participate in either the senior and junior competition. This was exceeded with over 100 participantst being involved with the structured competition.

The club wanted to keep the cost to participants low and the grant funded the equipment, promotion and administration of the project.

The club wanted to motivate inactive people and it felt that the social aspect of the project will encourage increased participation, many households currently have table tennis tables in the town however the competition and coaching will enable these people to gain the skills to improve their ability in this sport.

The project was designed for participants starting at different physical levels and the sport did not require high levels of fitness to participate and a family environment where all family members can participate.

PROJECT PERFORMANCE

In the original application for the grant the project performance was going to be measured by several milestones including:

1.The commencement of at least 60 players in the program.

The club has achieved over 100 players per week over the first 15 weeks.

2. A range of players including youth, Indigenous and mature aged over 45 years.

Players of all age groups including Indigenous players have been involved; coaching has been arranged for **25 Indigenous youth** from a nearby Primary School.

3. A structured competition will commence within the first 2 months.

The first 13-week structured competition has finished with the next competition to start on the 11th of September with 8 teams in each grade.

4. An inter town match to take place within the first 12 months.

An Intertown game was played against Whyalla in October 2006 and there are plans to keep this as a regular event.

5. Coaching sessions with local coaches and a State coach will take place in the first year.

State Coaching took place in December 2006, and local coaches have been involved with juniors during the competition and on Monday nights.

6. Coaching accreditation training delivered to at least 2 participants.

Coaching accreditation took place for 2 individuals in January 2007 when they undertook Table Tennis level 1 Coaching training in Adelaide.

The Committee is confident that the current structure has the ability to provide a sustainable competition into the second year with the ability to fund ongoing competition and stability in the number of players.

Summary

It is expected that through this project more people will join the Club with the opportunity for ongoing practice on the tables at the club.

The competition will provide an opportunity to bring new people to the club to network and socialise with Indigenous and non Indigenous participants alike.

The program will aim to introduce a sport to people who do not currently participate in other activities and the health and well being benefits from this will be ongoing.

There has been enough interest to be positive about the future of the program after the grant funding ceased in December 2006. With over 40 keen adults and over 30 enthusiastic juniors and ongoing support through coaching and co-ordination the club is confident that the competition can sustain itself in 2007.

2006 TABLE TENNIS FINALS

The finals night of Table Tennis for the reformed competition produced some thrilling finishes in both Juniors and Seniors last Monday night. In both grades the Premiers were decided in the last game of the night with the 2nd placed teams defeating the Minor premiers on the night.

In the Juniors Bulldogs 18 sets defeated Bloods 17 sets in a great finish, Craig White and Craig Shirley both winning their singles but were defeated in the vital doubles match by Greg Shirley and Ben Trewartha.

Adam Bentley had a great night for the Bloods with 3 wins and for the Premiers Nathan Nistico and David Parsons kept their consistent form with 3 wins.

In the other games Magpies 15 games defeated Hawks 6 sets to hand Hawks the wooden spoon, Marcus Gill was best for the Magpies with 3 wins,

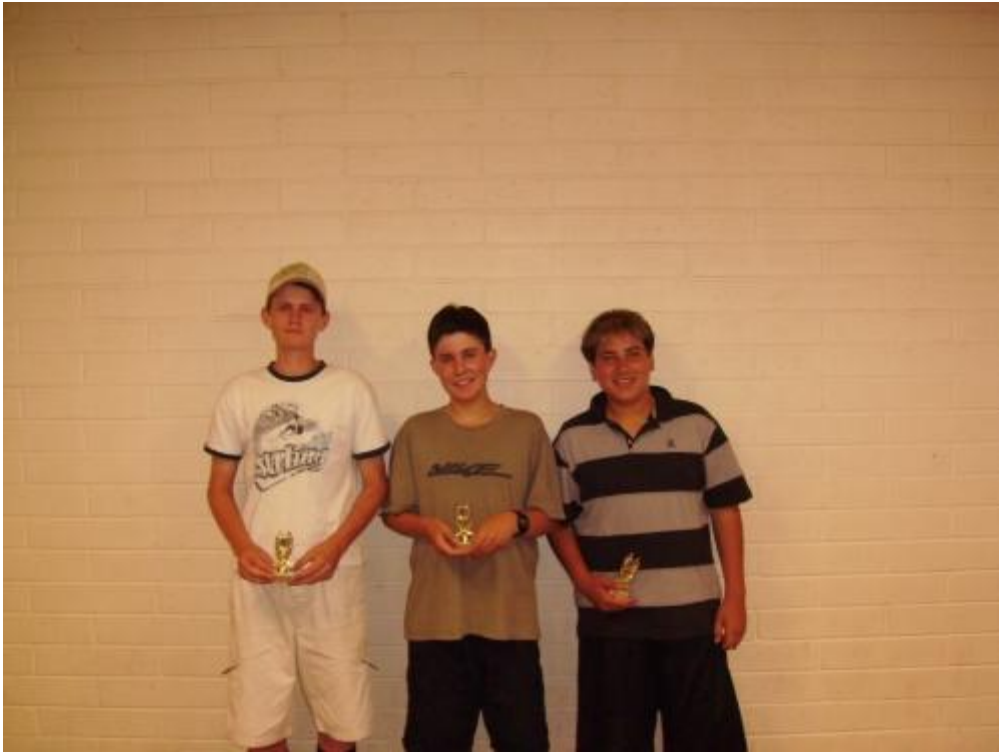

BAXTERS THE DIFFERENCE IN TABLE TENNIS GRAND FINAL

In a tight finish Port Augusta Refrigeration Eagles overcame Sportscene Hawks in a classic grand final of the Seniors in the Flinders Power Premiership 2007 to win their second championship in a row.

The match was still in the balance with the experienced Ian Harris taking on Veteran Reg Yates in the last game with Ian winning in 4 sets.

Port Augusta Refrigeration Eagles won their third consecutive premiership in Table Tennis after a hard-fought win over Magic Fm Power winning by 1 rubber in the big game.

In an exciting finish Eagles had too much fire power in the top 3 players and reversed a loss to Power in the 2nd semi final, winning 11 rubbers 39 sets to 10 rubbers 37 sets in a tight finish.
